Dear Secondary Students and Parents:

Season 2 of After School Activities (ASA), which includes non-fee activities, fee activities, and competitive sports, will begin on Monday, November 17. Registration for these activities will take place in two weeks, Monday, November 10 through Wednesday, November 12, 2008 before and after school, during the break (9:22-9:37am) and at lunchtime (11:30-11:55pm). **Students must fill out the attached registration form and pay for any fee activities by 3pm on Wednesday, November 12 in order to be registered for the activity. NO EXCEPTIONS!** This will allow us to make sure that there are enough students involved in the activity for it to continue, as there must be a minimum of 5 students registered.

For registration, students and parents should discuss their schedules, academic workload, and opportunities for involvement in the school community's activities. Please keep in mind that things work a bit differently at the Secondary level, as we make attempts to help students become increasingly independent and self-reliant. Review the following list of activities that are offered and the attached schedule. Students should not register for two activities that meet on the same day unless the times do not conflict. Please complete the attached registration form and turn it in to Ms. Olsen with any fees by Wednesday, November 13 at 3pm.

The non-fee activities that we will be offering for Season 2 are:

- Art Club
- Choir (for credit)
- Current Issues & Events
- Frisbee Golf
- Girls' Lacrosse
- Math Counts and Tutorials
- Model UN
- NHS/NJHS

The fee activities we will be offering for a N4500 fee per day per week for 10 weeks involved in the activity for Season 2 are:

- Dance
- Karate
- Tennis
- Yoga

In addition, we will also have the following competitive sports train and play during Season 2 that requires a one-time competitive sports fee of US\$50 or N6,000:

- Competitive Boys' Basketball
- Competitive Co-Ed Swimming
- Competitive Girls' Basketball

## ACTIVITY DESCRIPTIONS

### Non-Fee Activities:

1. *Math Counts & Tutorials* will meet with Mrs. Hicks meets 6:55-7:25am every weekday. This activity is designed for students to participate in math competitions. It will also offer students an opportunity to receive additional instruction in their Secondary Math courses. There is no need to sign up for this activity. Students can attend as needed or interested.
2. *Art Club* meets with Mr. Purdy once a week to work on various art techniques and projects around the school. Students will also explore digital design. The club will also work on artwork for school and regional emblems in addition to other projects as they arise. The club will meet on Tuesdays. Students interested in participating should sign up for Art Club.
3. *Choir* is offered as an ASA; however, Mrs. Reese is also offering credit for students' transcripts for participation and regular attendance. The scheduling allows students to participate in choir and not have it conflict with other activities. The Choir will take place on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 3-3:55pm. If students are involved in other after school activities they can leave choir at 3:30pm.
4. *NJHS/NHS* stands for National Junior Honor Society (Middle School) and National Honor Society (High School). Students will become a member of this prestigious US-based organization. It promotes consistent academic excellence, responsibility, ethical behavior, good character, and service learning through its activities. Ms. Burns is the sponsor for the High School and Mr. Teague and Mrs. Rainbolt are the sponsors for the Middle School.
5. *Model UN* with Mr. Sobera and Mr. Phipps is a group that conducts research on current topics. They investigate the stance the United Nations countries politicians would take on those topics in order to carry out a simulation of the UN processes. This is a group that may also have the opportunity to interact with other schools.
6. *Current Issues & Events* with Mr. Reese will be an open forum in order to discuss, question, and debate contemporary issues and current events. The activity will take place on Thursdays. Students interested in participating should sign up for Current Issues & Events.
7. *Frisbee Golf* with Mr. Olson is an opportunity to learn to play this fun game where you toss a Frisbee and see how few tosses it takes you to make it from the "tee box", or starting point, to the "hole", or a hula hoop a distance away from the tee box.
8. *Girls' Lacrosse* with Mr. and Mrs. Gunther is an opportunity for girls to learn this unique North American game, improve hand-eye coordination, learn teamwork, and be physically fit.

Fee Activities:

1. *Dance* is offered twice a week on Mondays and Wednesdays and allows students the opportunity to learn different styles of dance.
2. *Karate* is offered twice a week on Mondays and Wednesdays and specializes in advancing students throughout this various levels of this martial art.
3. *Tennis* is offered twice a week on Tuesdays and Thursdays and will offer students ability level instruction within a group setting.

Competitive Sports:

1. *Competitive Boys' and Girls' Basketball* will require tryouts this year, which means that there will be a selection process for our Varsity competitive teams. Coaches will begin their tryouts the first week of the season and will select those who will participate on the Varsity competitive team. Those who are not selected to play on the Varsity team will still have the opportunity to play on the Junior Varsity team, where they will get the opportunity to continue to develop their skills. The teams will train twice and rotating three times a week. Students will be expected to attend practice regularly from 3:30-5pm. This is the equivalent of competitive school athletic programs in the United States, therefore the time commitment and level of rigor is high. Students will hone their abilities in the sport, represent and promote pride in AISL at local, regional, and international games, and will benefit from working as a member of a team. Participation on the competitive team will require a US\$50 or N6,000 to compete. This fee will cover referees fees, transportation to away games, league dues, maintenance and renewal of equipment, etc. Students who have paid this fee during Season 1 for Competitive Soccer need not pay this fee again. **THIS ACTIVITY WILL BEGIN THE FIRST WEEK OF DECEMBER ON THE SPORTCOURT AND WILL CONTINUE IN THE GYM UPON COMPLETION OF THE SECONDARY MUSICAL.**
2. *Competitive Co-Ed Swimming* is a new competitive sport at AISL. The team will train three times each week from 3:30-5pm. This is the equivalent of competitive school athletic programs in the United States, therefore the time commitment and level of rigor is high. Students will hone their abilities in the sport, represent and promote pride in AISL at local, regional, and international games, and will benefit from working as a member of a team. Participation on the competitive team will require a US\$50 or N6,000 to compete. This fee will cover referees fees, transportation to away games, league dues, maintenance and renewal of equipment, etc. Students who have paid this fee during Season 1 for Competitive Soccer need not pay this fee again. There are no tryouts for Competitive Co-Ed Swimming at this time.

## Fair Play

Just a reminder that Saturday Soccer is a recreational league where we want to encourage participation of all types of player. I've had a couple of reports of tackles getting a bit hard resulting injuries to players. I've asked the referees to be strict on this and use their yellow and even red cards if they feel players are at risk of injury.

This is particularly important in Divisions D/E (Girls grades 5-11) and

Division G (Boys Grades 7-11) where there are significant age ranges in a single team. Please help us by encouraging competitive but fair and safe play on the field.

## Touchline Support

Kids love parental support from the touchline but please also help *all* the kids focus on the game by keeping it positive and balanced. No coaching from behind the goals as well as this unfairly disturbs the goalkeepers.

## Injuries and Shin Guards

Please remember shin-guards are **MANDATORY** for match play and I will ask coaches/referees not to allow players without onto the field on Saturdays.
